Organisations give views on mental health support



Organisations across Bath and North East Somerset (BaNES), Swindon and Wiltshire have shared their views on how mental health support could be provided closer to people's homes.

We worked with Healthwatch BaNES and Healthwatch Swindon to <u>hear the views of 22</u> <u>organisations</u> on three main themes:

- What have you heard from the people you support?
- How can this be improved and what do we want to keep?
- How are we going to achieve this?

This feedback ties in with earlier workshops listening to <u>what local people thought good</u> <u>community mental health support should look like</u> and will be used to help develop new services.

Views of GWH patients revealed in joint project

Experiences of patients at Great Western Hospital July 2021 A joint Healthwatch project looking at the experiences of patients using the Great Western Hospital (GWH) in Swindon has revealed that while most people were happy with the care they'd received, there were areas where improvements could be made.

We worked with Healthwatch Swindon and <u>Healthwatch</u> <u>West Berkshire</u> to listen to the experiences of 196 people who had used the Emergency Department and four inpatient wards at GWH in July 2021.

A mix of online surveys, Covid-safe face to face visits, virtual interviews and phone calls were used to gather feedback. <u>Read our report</u> to find out more about what we heard.
