Report highlights lack of LGBTQ+ support



Young people who identify as LGBTQ+ say there are few health and care services in Wiltshire to support them, and a lack of understanding from healthcare professionals has left them feeling unheard and disrespected.

These are <u>the key findings of a project</u> carried out by our <u>Young Healthwatch Wiltshire</u> volunteers focusing on what young people aged 11-25 thought of the support they'd received and what they'd like to see in schools, colleges, workplaces and local communities.

A service which provides equipment to people's homes to help them live more independently, such as wheelchairs, walking frames and hoists, is highly valued by those who use it, <u>a Healthwatch Wiltshire</u> <u>report reveals</u>.
